

The Philosophy of John Locke

The nine chapters cover the breadth of Locke's philosophical interests from natural philosophy to politics and theology, from Locke's famous *Essay concerning Human Understanding* to his *Two Treatises of Government*. This volume provides a fresh analysis of many of the key ideas of this seminal thinker while simultaneously exploring new territory by the examination of manuscript materials and some of Locke's ancillary publications which have never before been discussed.

Building upon expertise in textual scholarship and a rich awareness of Locke's intellectual and political context, *The Philosophy of John Locke* takes us a step closer to the historical Locke. At the same time, however, it impresses upon us the power that many of Locke's ideas still exert today. This book will be of great interest to philosophers and to all students of the history of ideas.
